

## Terrific Times Tables

By the end of Year 4, children are expected to know their times tables and corresponding division facts up to  $12 \times 12$ , as stated in the National Curriculum. They should be able to recall a multiplication or division fact within about five seconds. Last week we checked this for children in Key Stage 2 and got some interesting results.

Out of a total score of 25, an average of 63% of children in Year 4 got 20 or more/ out of 25 and only 19% got full marks. Of course, there are still almost two terms to keep improving but this shows significant work needs to be done to improve these scores to meet age related expectations in Y4. We've seen similar results in Years 5 and 6. In Y5, 70% achieved 20+/25 and 32% achieved full marks. 71% of the Year 6 children scored over 20 out of 25 and 35% achieved 25/25. This is a YEAR 4 expectation so all Y5 and 6 should be scoring highly on times tables facts.

In school, we explore times tables so children have a secure understanding of the concept of multiplication and division and the various patterns and sequences related to each times table. There is also regular practise in class. We encourage regular tables practise at home which are then tested in school. Thank you for supporting your child with this.

Top tip!  $7 \times 8 = 56$  is one of the hardest facts to know. Here's a way that might help. Reverse the statement:  $56 = 7 \times 8$ . Look at the sequence of the digits ... 5, 6, 7, 8. 56 equals 7 times 8.

If you're confident your child knows their tables, don't forget to help them know related facts. So,  $3 \times 8 = 24$ , which means...

- 8 x 3 = 24
- $24 \div 8 = 3$
- $24 \div 3 = 8$
- 30 x 8 = 240
- 3 x 80 = 240
- 30 x 80 = 2,400
- $3 \times 0.8 = 2.4$  and so on!

### Phonics Round Up

Reception have started phase 3 of the 'Letters and Sounds' phonics programme. The purpose of this phase is to:

- teach more graphemes, most of which are made of two letters, for example, 'oa' as in boat
- practise blending and segmenting a wider set of CVC words, for example, fizz, chip, sheep, light
- learn all letter names and begin to form them correctly
- read more tricky words and begin to spell some of them
- read and write words in phrases and sentences

Here are some examples of words the children will be reading: tail, week, right, soap, food, park, burn, cord, town, soil.

#### Tricky words!

During phase 3 the children will learn more 'tricky words': he, she, we, me, be, was, my, you, her, they, all, said. They will also be expected to begin to write sentences independently.

Our next phonics mornings will be held on February 5<sup>th</sup> where parents of pupils in Reception – Year 2 will be invited into school to observe phonics sessions. Further information will be distributed by Miss Vallance, our phonics lead, shortly.

#### Flu

You will have heard in the media of cases of Flu being confirmed nationally. Whilst there are no confirmed cases in our school at this time we want to ensure that our children remain healthy and take every precaution against the spread of the virus. In our school children are given the following advice which I would be grateful if you could continue to promote in your home:

- **CATCH IT** Cover your nose and mouth when coughing and sneezing and use a tissue
- **BIN IT** Dispose of dirty tissues and bin them immediately.
- KILL IT Maintain good basic hygiene e.g. wash your hands frequently with soap and water

We have been advised that if your child has any of the following symptoms: fever (37.8°C or higher) and any one of the following: tiredness, cough, sore throat, muscle pain, runny nose or congestion, wheezing, please ring to inform us of their absence and keep them off school for at least 5 days.

#### Did you know?

'AREs' refers to the age-related expectations for each year group in Reading, Writing, Maths, Science and the Foundation Subjects, all to be found on the Curriculum Matters page on our website. These expectations have been taken from the National Curriculum, which sets out what teachers need to teach and what children are expected to learn, expectations and breaking them down into more manageable year groups.

These expectations are a really useful basis to know how you can support your child at home and where they are expected to be in terms of national standards.
