Prior to Parents' Evening Y1 – Y6 parents are invited to meet with their child/children & look through their books with them in school on Monday 19<sup>th</sup> March from 2pm. The aim of this session is to give you an overview of your child's work and progress. If you cannot come to this session do not worry as your child's books will be available on the evening.

## Easter Activities

It's the time of year again when we launch our Easter activities. Please see below for each age group's task:

## Internet Safety

It has come to my attention that some of our pupils as young as Year 3 have their own Facebook and You Tube feeds. The minimum age to open an account on Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, Pinterest, Tumblr, Kik, & Snapchat is **13**. For Vine, Tinder & Yik Yak it's **17** and YouTube requires account holders to be **18**, although a 13 year old can sign up with parental permission. We don't want to control parents but we DO want to keep our children safe so please check their settings! We often say, if you wouldn't wear it on a billboard in public; don't say it in a public domain (even if you think it is safe!)

With this in mind we have planned a 1 hour parent workshop on 'Keeping your child safe in the virtual world' on Tuesday 27<sup>th</sup> March at 2pm. Refreshments will be available and this will give you an introduction to staying safe online. All welcome, this workshop will really help you keep your child safe.

## Learn more about SATs

You'll be aware that there have been lots of changes in education in the last few years, including a new curriculum with greater expectations and assessment without levels. End of key stage tests (usually called the SATs) will be taken in May by children in Year 2 (end of KS1) and Year 6 (end of KS2). ## Helping with homework...

You might have heard the recent news story that said [UK parents help less with homework](#) than parents in other countries. Parents in the UK are much less likely to spend more than an hour per day helping with their children's homework compared with parents in other countries, a survey suggests. A survey of 27,830 parents in 29 countries found only 11% of UK parents spent an hour per day helping their children, far behind 62% in India.

Our Home Learning Policy is based on research about the effectiveness of homework and it is designed to best meet the needs of our pupils and their parents / carers.

Our **Creative homework** is an opportunity for your child to choose whatever they want to demonstrate some learning. For example, *I can show what I know about the Great Fire of London*. Your child could present their learning in different ways, from a diagram, a model with notes to a story or comic strip. Parents' and carers' role is to support, encourage and help, but not to take over and create the homework! There's no need to sit down and do the homework with your child as we want to see what they can do! The fact that your child and you are both actively doing something can be a really good way to promote positive attitudes.

**Talk Time homework** is intended to promote good speaking and listening skills, and quite often raises awareness of moral issues such as whether or not animals should be kept in zoos. To get the most from Talk Time homework we advise you to turn the television off and have a conversation whilst eating your dinner – you don't need to spend extra, separate time to support your child! Encourage your child to use ambitious words, useful phrases and full sentences such as:

- What are your views on ...?
- That's a good point, but ...
- Another reason is ...
- I hear what you're saying. However, ...
- Furthermore, ...
- In conclusion, ...
- I believe that ... because...

The other type of homework is **Practice Makes Perfect**. The work should be fairly straightforward for the child as it consolidates classwork so there should be no need for new learning, just some encouragement from you. However, it would be a great time to get your child to teach you what they have been learning! You might want to check what your child has done at the end.

Don't forget that the most important things you can do at home to support learning are to be positive and encourage your child and to make sure they read regularly, practise their spellings and practise maths – counting, number bonds and their times tables as they move into KS1. If you have any queries about home learning just see your child's teacher.
