## Lost Property

The amount of lost property has increased this year and we do not have the facility to keep it in storage for long. It would help if clothing was named so that we can attempt to reacquire lost sweat shirts, shorts, socks, shoes, trousers, bags, gloves and hats with the right children. All lost property box has been relocated to a central space – in a blue cupboard outside the hall – and after Whit we are going to introduce a policy of keeping unclaimed clothing for only two weeks before being discarded. Please check the cupboard regularly if your child's clothing has gone missing.

## The sun has got its hat on

Whilst the weather may be erratic at the moment with blazing sunshine one minute and pouring rain the next, we need to be prepared and ensure our children are sun safe. As always in the summer term, we ask parents to apply 'once a day' sunscreen to the children to ensure they're protected from the sun all day. Caps or sunhats can be worn outside and water bottles must be brought to school on a daily basis. These need to be filled with water, NOT JUICE, and can be re-filled by the children during the day. Please remember to name hats and sweat shirts as they often take them off when they are hot.

## Childhood Illnesses

Parents often ask us about common childhood illnesses and the rules about returning to school. We have guidance from the Health Protection Agency that we follow and thought it would be useful to summarise here:

- **Chicken Pox** Return to school 5 days after the onset of the rash, after it has become dry and crusted over
- **Slapped Cheek:** Fine to come into school
- **Scarlett Fever:** 24 hours after the antibiotics have started. Please bring antibiotics to school and sign over at the office
- **Sickness and Diarrhoea:** Return to school 48 hours after the LAST bout of sickness or diarrhoea
- **Head Lice:** Please treat your child at home – they DO NOT need to be off school. If we see live headlice on a child's head, we will phone parents to come and collect in order to apply treatment at the earliest opportunity.

You will receive your individual logins next week and can login via our website by selecting parent login on the top black bar or the School Spider app. In the meantime please download the free app from Google Play or Apple App Store by searching School Spider. You will receive an email when there is something you need to complete; if you are logged into the app you will also receive notifications so please turn notifications ON!

### Using the app

When you download the app, select our school using the dropdown bar. Once you have done this you can access recent news/gallery/blogs/calendar items we have posted on the website.

To receive information related to your child/children, select Parent Login and enter the username and password we send you. If you have more than one child at the school, click on the child's name and it will show all other children in the school so you can switch accounts.

You will receive notifications informing you what you need to complete, use the icons on the bottom row to respond. You can watch [this YouTube tutorial](#) on the app for more information.

**Please ensure once you have logged in you have notifications turned on. We will be using this to replace text messaging so it's important you do this.**
