## Website & App update

The [new look website](#) is now live and we've had lots of positive comments about it. Curriculum newsletters and key year group information are on individual class pages so that they are easy to locate. Key dates are on the website calendar.

We have also launched the app which will allow you to receive important information directly from us quickly and easily. Individual logins have been sent via email so that you can log in by selecting *parent login* on the top black bar or the School Spider app. If you haven't downloaded the free app please search *School Spider* from Google Play or Apple App Store. You will receive an email when there is something you need to complete/read. **Please ensure once you have logged in you have notifications turned on. We will be using this to replace text messaging from September so it's important you do this.**

### Using the app

When you download the app, select our school using the dropdown bar. Once you have done this you can access recent news/gallery/blogs/calendar items posted on the website.

To receive information related to your child/children, select Parent Login and enter the username and password we sent you. If you have more than one child at school, click on the child's name and it will show all other children in the school so you can switch accounts. **If you have a problem with this [let the office know](#) and we will alter settings in SIMS.**

## Your views matter

We are always keen to hear your views. Most parents and carers are happy to let us know at any point if something's gone wrong – and many tell us when things have gone well! However, it's always useful to collect your views on some standard questions – the same questions that Ofsted use during inspections. We ask that you visit a survey which is available via our new website and respond to a series of statements – either agree / agree strongly or disagree / disagree strongly or say that you don't know. The statements include:

- My child is happy at school
- My child feels safe at this school.
- My child makes good progress at this school.
- My child is well looked after.
- My child is taught well.

There is also the opportunity to add any comments you may have. The survey should take you about five minutes – maybe a bit longer if you add lots of comments. The survey opens today and will remain open over the Whit holidays until Sunday 10 June at 9pm.

The results of the survey will be used by school leaders, including the governing board, to shape what we do in the future so your views really do matter. As always, if you've any questions, comments of concerns, do let us know.

## School meals price increase

We have been informed by Dolce that school meals are increasing by 5p to £2.25 per child from September 2018.

## Reminders

- The **school car park** is for STAFF only. We have over 50 staff and parking is reserved for them. The only exception to this is for parents/carers who hold a disabled Blue Badge. Please display this if you are using the car park.
- Please remember that we are a **nut free school**. We may have pupils who have life threatening reaction to nuts and so we are extremely vigilant about keeping nuts out of school. Unfortunately some children are still bringing foods to school containing nuts - this is often in the form of a chocolate spread such as Nutella or chocolate pancakes. Please remember that these spreads contain hazelnuts and can affect a susceptible child.
- **Reduce – Reuse – Recycle**  
We are trying to increase awareness of plastic pollution. The school council will be talking to Mr Henderson and Mrs Haskayne and reporting back to their classes about the environmental impact of recycling and making a plan to develop more recycling in school. One way we can increase this is by having a focus on single use plastics. To help reduce the use of these we would like you to join us by bringing snack and lunchbox items in reusable tubs and where possible, to use paper sandwich bags rather than plastic. Together we can significantly reduce the amount of single use plastic we use and throw away.

## Attendance matters

Regular school attendance is the key to getting a good education. Research shows:

- the higher the percentage of sessions missed across Key Stage 2, the lower the likely level of attainment at the end of Year 6
- there is a gradual decrease in achievement as overall absence rates increase
- children with high attendance (97%+) make better progress and our own assessment data shows this
- children who have been absent for long periods tend to make slower academic progress, and the social and emotional aspects of school life are adversely affected in many cases

Our school attendance target is **97%** and I am pleased that five classes achieved this target in May. Here are May's attendance figures:

- **Reception Pearl** : 97.65%
- **Reception Sapphire**: 93.85%
- **Year 1 Jet**: 97.62%
- **Year 1 Ruby**: 94.60%
- **Year 2 Topaz**: 98.26%
- **Year 2 Amber**: 96.39%
- **Year 3 Amethyst**: 96.67%
- **Year 4 Jade**: 97.89%
- **Year 4 Opal**: 96.79%
- **Year 5 Aquamarine**: 92.17%
- **Year 5 Onyx**: 93.04%
- **Year 6 Emerald**: 97.22%

Our overall school attendance for May is **96.03%**. I know that we can work together to reach our target but talking about attendance ... read on!

## Holidays in term time

We are concerned at the number of absences from school as a result of family holidays or visiting relatives. Please note that no permission for absence for holidays during term time will be given unless there are exceptional circumstances. If a child misses 5 or more school days then an Education Penalty Notice of £60 per parent per child may be issued by the local authority. Already this year the local authority have issued 6 to our families.
